# **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

In August 2018, TennesseeCAN conducted a survey of school leaders and a survey of district leaders from across the state. This document presents the key takeaways on education opinions from both groups.

# See some change

71%

A majority of district and school leaders want to see some sort of change to the BEP funding formula. 0% of district leaders think it should be left as is.

### In favor

63%

A majority of district and school leaders would support an extended school year or school day, given the necessary resources and state support.



74% of school leaders

A majority of school leaders consider either the effectiveness of the teacher/classroom a student had the previous year or a student's achievement levels from the previous year when placing them in a classroom for the coming school year.

## In favor

41%

A combined 41% of district and school leaders would support weighting funding based on student needs.\*



77% Budget



63% Staffing

Budget and staffing continue to be the largest perceived impediments to student success for district and school leaders.



33% of district leaders

Few district leaders say they have the resources and support to build and maintain adequate facilities.

<sup>\*</sup> Many respondents were unsure or said it "depends." Only 25% said they would not support weighting funding based on student needs.
