

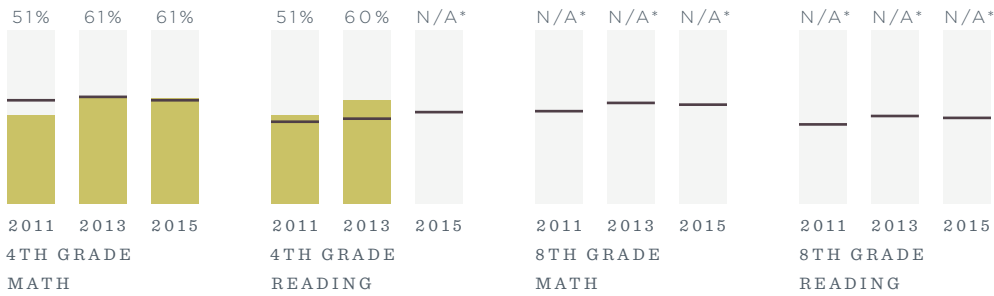

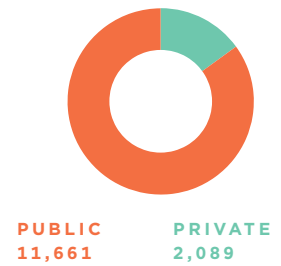

AAPI PUBLIC VS. PRIVATE SCHOOL ENROLLMENT IN TENNESSEE, 2011-2012



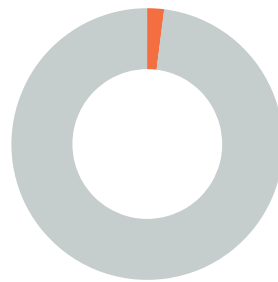
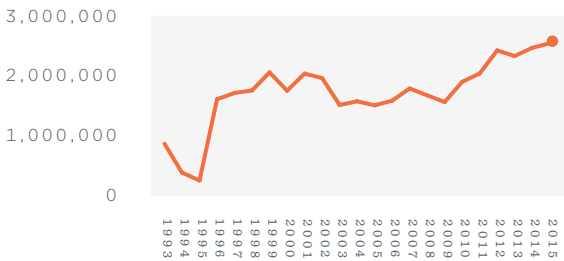

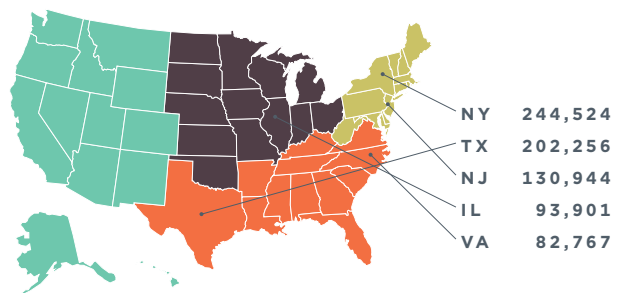

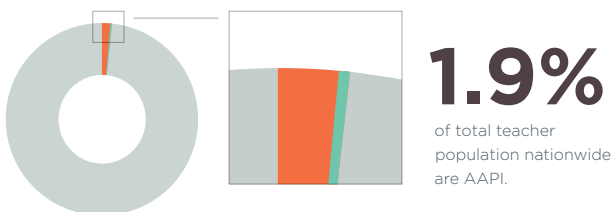

TOP FIVE STATES WITH LARGEST AAPI PUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT, 2014-2015

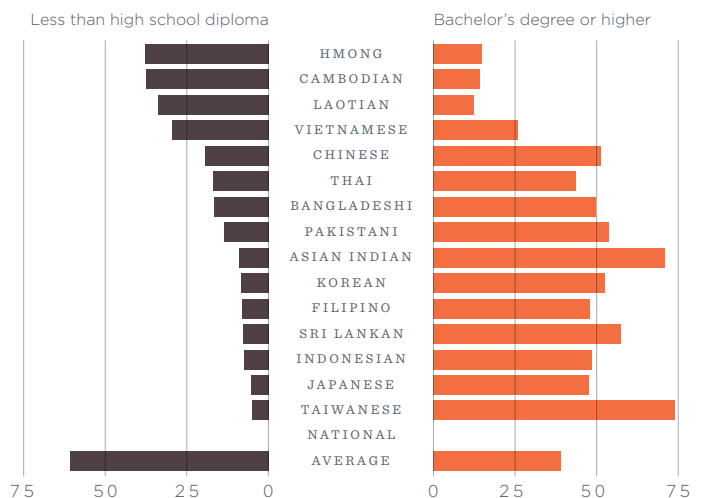
